

All Things Story Virtual Workshop Series

Frequently Asked Questions – for Participants

What can be learned through this monthly virtual workshop series?

Explore performance to applied storytelling through experts in various fields. Most presenters will be professional storytellers though expect other special guests within the performing arts and education worlds.

How does registration and tuition work?

Registration is required no matter what fee you choose to pay through the sliding scale option. The minimum is \$5.00 though suggested donation is \$25.00. You may want to contribute higher than the suggested amount on up to \$50.00 as this benefits the Master Story Facilitator. You can find registration at <http://www.storycrossroads.org/AllThingsStory> that is run through Wild Apricot/AffiniPay.

What if I pay \$25+ for the workshop? Is it true I receive the audio and video?

Yes, if you choose to pay \$25+, then the audio and video will be sent to you through wetransfer.com to your email. You will need to download it within a week of receiving that email from wetransfer.com. These recordings are only for your private use to reflect on what you learned.

When will I receive the Zoom link and passcode? What about the handout?

The day before the workshop, you'll receive an email with the Zoom link/passcode. Every workshop has at least a 1-page handout with key talking points that will be emailed the same day after the course.

When do I log on?

Any session begins promptly at start time. The Zoom virtual meeting space will open 15 minutes before to show a 5-minute Zoom basics video (etiquette) and allow a couple minutes to chat/get-to-know people. I've heard of Zoombombing by inappropriate people; will we be safe?

We'll have 1-2 Zoom monitors besides our Master Story Facilitator who will specifically protect people.

Where does this take place? Do we need supplies? Best Internet connection?

You need a device (phone, iPad, desktop, or laptop). There is a free Zoom app for your phone, but you do not have as many options as a participant as you would on a laptop or desktop. We recommend being directly linked to the Ethernet rather than wi-fi for a stronger connection. Some people hook up an Ethernet cord to the modem already at their home so they can take the device to a preferred room.
